Cozumel, Quintana Roo, Mexico. About 12 BAD divers and their friends and 16 other Bay Area Houston divers landed in Cozumel on August 23, 2004. The 28 divers arrived in Cozumel earlier than planned and checked-in at the beautiful HOTEL COZUMEL & RESORT HOTEL. BADDIES did a couple of shore dives and an afternoon boat dive on the first day. The group proclaimed Peña Coladas, Dos Equi's, and Cuba Libra's as the official drinks of the group in the hotel's all-inclusive bars.

The HOTEL COZUMEL hacienda-style 178-room re service PADI Gold Palm became the rendezvous r buffet breakfast each morr



with two-tank boat dives with two-tank boat dives sites as far south as Columbia Reef to the La Villa Blanca Drop-off. Green Sea Turtles, Hawksbill Turtles, Moray Eels, Manta Rays, King Crabs, Lobsters, Blacktip Reef Sharks, and Gray Reef Sharks were spotted by the divers. More fish were seen on this trip than ever including huge Groupers, Triggerfish, Angelfish, Parrotfish, Palometa, Scorpionfish, Butterflyfish, Hogfish, Snapper, Squirrelfish, and Tomtate just to name a few. The beautiful Cozumel beaches and crystal clear water are always a delight to everyone. Water temperatures were a constant 82 degrees and visibility exceeded 200 feet.

Each afternoon the group split up, some going to town for shopping, some making afternoon boat and shore dives, and some relaxing in one of the hotel bars. Divers played tennis, ping-pong, and some made use of the wireless internet included in the trip package. Some rented Jeeps. One group of BADDIES took a trip to Chichen-Itza, the most important and extraordinary city of the Mayan civilization, to discover the magnificence of pyramids built by one of the greatest civilizations of the ancient world. The group ate dinner at the hotel and some went to restaurants, clubs, and taquerias in San Miguel.

The night diving was great. Lots of friendly Octopus were encountered.

After checking-in at the Cozumel airport for the return flight, the group met one last time at the airport coffee shop and all agreed they had a great time. Five days of diving and relaxation prompted travelers to want to make the trip again next year.



Los Angeles California: Open Water (The Movie) dove

into wide release at theatres independent film was made for at sold to Lions Gate Films for \$2,50 Film Festival. It is a typical inde editing, grainy photography, and missing the quality created by trip and steadicams used by profess

The story jumps right to the disastrous boat dive within minutes of the opening titles and movie-goers have no reason to even care about these divers since there is no real character development at the beginning of the movie. The Divernaster makes a few standard lokes during his briefing, a know-it-all diver forgets to bring his mask, and a female diver can't clear her ears and aborts the dive. Miles from shore, twenty divers go on to make a typical recreational dive. The dive is un-eventful until the boat leaves the dive site before the last two divers surface. The movie audience shares about 70 minutes of boring and predictable dialog as the divers bobble on the surface before the shocking and depressing ending.

The movie carefully avoids telling audiences where the dive resort is or what certification agency was involved. The divers encounter more sharks at the surface than the average diver would see on a week of baited shark dives. We do learn that the couple have earned "Open Water Diver" certifications.

The music selected doesn't match the films locale and doesn't inspire one to go on a tropical vacation. I suggest you save your movie money and use it to go on an extra dive during my next Cozumel trip. I would give the movie a rating of 1 fin.
