



## **Overpopulation Killing Caribbean Coral Reefs**

**CARIBBEAN (9 Jan 2008)** — Coral reefs in the Caribbean have suffered significant changes due to the proximal effects of a growing human population, reports a new study.



"It is well acknowledged that coral reefs are declining worldwide but the driving forces remain hotly debated," said author Camilo Mora at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Canada. "In the Caribbean alone, these losses are endangering a large number of species, from corals to sharks, and jeopardizing over 4 billion dollars in services worth from fisheries, tourism and coastal protection," he added.

"The continuing degradation of coral reefs may be soon beyond repair, if threats are not identified and rapidly controlled," Mora said. "This new study moves from the traditional localized study of threats to a region-wide scale, while simultaneously analyzing contrasting socioeconomic and environmental variables," he added.

The study monitored coral reefs, including corals, fishes and macroalgae, in 322 sites across 13 countries throughout the Caribbean. The study was complemented with a comprehensive set of socioeconomic databases on human population density, coastal development, agricultural land use and environmental and ecological databases, which included temperature, hurricanes, productivity, coral diseases and richness of corals. The data were analyzed with robust statistical approaches to reveal the causes of coral reef degradation in that region.

The study showed clearly that the number of people living in close proximity to coral reefs is the main driver of the mortality of corals, loss of fish biomass and increases in macroalgae abundance. A comparative analysis of different human impacts revealed that coastal development, which increases the amount of sewage and fishing pressure (by facilitating the storage and export of fishing products) was mainly responsible for the mortality of corals and loss of fish biomass.

Additionally, the area of cultivated land (a likely surrogate for agrochemical discharges to coral reefs) was the main driver of increases in macroalgae. Coral mortality was further accelerated by warmer temperatures.

## **Oceanic and Aeris Recall Regulator First Stages:**

More than 6,000 regulator first stages manufactured in the U.S and in Taiwan are being recalled due to reports of uncontrolled air flow to the second stage. Oceanic is recalling FDX-10 and CDX-5 first stages and Aeris is recalling its T400-type first stages. The bad parts were shipped to retailers between May 1 and November 15, 2006. But Oceanic's other DX series First Stages (CDX, DXi, DX3, DX4 and TDX5) and Aeris's other diaphragm-type first stages that were serviced between May 1, 2006 and October 22, 2007 may also be affected. ## **Warming Risks Antarctic Sea Life**

Unique marine life in Antarctica will be at risk from an invasion of sharks, crabs and other predators if global warming continues, scientists warn.

Crabs are poised to return to the Antarctic shallows, threatening creatures such as giant sea spiders and floppy ribbon worms, says a UK-US team.

Some have evolved without predators for tens of millions of years.

Bony fish and sharks would move in if waters warm further, threatening species with extinction, they say.

In the last 50 years, sea surface temperatures around Antarctica have risen by 1 to 2C, which is more than twice the global average.

## VANDENBERG SCHEDULED TO SINK MAY 15

Latest artificial reef for the Florida Keys is eagerly anticipated by the diving community.

**KEY WEST, Florida Keys** -- Project organizers, overseeing the transformation of a retired U.S. Air Force missile tracking ship into an artificial reef off Key West have set May 15 as the scheduled sink date.



"This is a major event for us, a great opportunity for the health of the reef as well as an economic shot in the arm for the Keys," said Chris Norwood, president of Artificial Reefs of the Keys. "Tens of thousands of people have been waiting to hear this date."

Currently, the General Hoyt S. Vandenberg is in a Norfolk, Va., shipyard with workers removing environmental hazards, prior to its scuttling in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary.

Officials with Reefmakers, the project's facilitator, are planning to coordinate towing of the 522-foot-long vessel to Key West sometime in March for final preparations.

The Vandenberg project should provide additional marine habitat and provide a new attraction for recreational divers, to relieve pressure on natural coral reefs.

"Not only do artificial reefs divert recreational user pressure from natural reefs, they also create a valuable habitat and new breeding grounds for the marine environment", said Joe Weatherby of Reefmakers. "The Vandenberg will provide tools and resources to create sustained educational, social and cultural programs while also generating substantial revenues for the community."

Before it was decommissioned in 1983, the Vandenberg also tracked manned U.S. space missions, beginning with Mercury blastoffs in the early 1960s. The ship "played" a role as a Russian science ship in "Virus," a 1999 motion picture starring Jamie Lee Curtis.

Funding for the project is coming from several local government and private-sector resources including the City of Key West and the Monroe County Tourist Development Council.

## I May Be Bent... Now What?

DAN continues its mission to develop better, Safer divers.



Many divers may not know that someone can get decompression illness even while following safe diving rules. To better educate divers, DAN has created a new DVD about DCI and what to do if you suspect a diver has it.

Joel Dovenbarger, Vice President of DAN Medical Services, said the best way for all divers to learn comes from the experiences of other divers. "This new DVD from DAN will help divers recognize the signs and symptoms of a variety of dive-related issues and be better prepared to respond appropriately," Dovenbarger said.

Dive centers or dive clubs can request the free DVD from DAN. It features a 40-minute presentation by Marty McCafferty, DAN Medical Informational Specialist. Use the DVD as part of your dive training programs, at your next dive club meeting or at dive gatherings.

The DVD emphasizes that the symptoms of DCI are similar to other medical conditions, such as a heart attack or upset stomach, so only a physician is qualified to make a diagnosis. The diver has three responsibilities:

- to recognize the signs and symptoms;
- to provide standard care within their levels of training; and
- to help transfer the injured diver to a higher level of care.

Denial is the most common reason for delay in seeking assistance. Injured divers usually call DAN because their symptoms will not go away. Amazingly almost 15 percent of injured divers continue to dive after initial DCI symptoms are recognized.

DAN wants to educate divers in recognizing DCI and seeking immediate medical evaluation, which improves and shortens the treatment and reduces the chances of long-term problems. The risk of DCI increases as divers dive deeper, stay down longer, ascend faster, or shorten their surface intervals.

# Gulf of Mexico Oil Spill

Vessel runs into drilling rig near marine sanctuary

Saturday's strong winds helped disperse diesel fuel that spilled in the Gulf of Mexico when an offshore supply ship collided with a drilling rig early Saturday morning.

The spill occurred before dawn about 140 miles southeast of Galveston and about 30 miles south of the Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary, an environmentally sensitive underwater area that's protected by the federal government.

"The wind is dispersing the fuel," Wine said, noting that while diesel is a volatile fuel, it evaporates rapidly. Wind gusts ranged 15 to 25 mph Saturday in Southeast Texas.

At 4:28 a.m., the Coast Guard Marine Safety Unit in Galveston received a call from the master of the Grady Fagan, a 193-foot offshore supply ship, reporting that the vessel had hit the rig Ocean Star as it was preparing to unload supplies, Wine said. An unknown amount of diesel fuel leaked from the ship's 9,000-gallon fuel tank, Wine said.

The crash also caused a 2-inch gash in the ship above the water line, Wine said. There was no damage reported to the rig.

A Coast Guard jet crew that flew over the site at 11 a.m. detected no visible pollution.

The owner of the Grady Fagan has hired Marine Spill Response Corp. to clean up the spill.

## Skip The Sunscreen While Diving

It can damage and even kill coral reefs, says a study in the journal *Environmental Health Perspectives*. Italian marine biologists have linked four UV-blocking chemicals in sunscreens to coral bleaching because they cause viral infections in the symbiotic algae that live inside reef-building coral. The viruses replicate until their algae hosts explode, infecting neighboring coral. The researchers estimate that 5,000 tons of sunscreen wash off people in oceans annually, and that up to 10 percent of coral reefs are threatened by sunscreen-induced bleaching.


