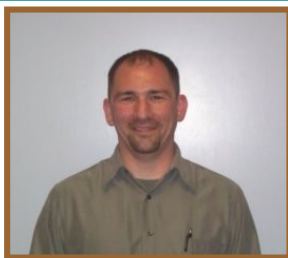

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## Baileys Irish Cream Cake



### YELLOW CAKE

- 4 cups Flour
- 2 cups Sugar
- 1 Tbsp., Plus 2 tsp. Baking Powder
- 2 tsp. Salt
- 2/3 cup Shortening
- 1 1/3 cups Baileys Irish Cream
- 2/3 cup Milk
- 2 Eggs
- 2 tsp. Vanilla extract

### BAILEYS SWIRL

- 8 oz. Cream Cheese, softened
- 1 Tbsp. Butter or Margarine
- 1 tsp. Vanilla Extract
- 1 lb. Powdered Sugar
- 1/4 cup Baileys Irish Cream
- 1 pkg. White Chocolate Chips

### BAILEYS GLAZE

- 3/4 cup Baileys Irish Cream
- 1 cup Powdered Sugar

### Yellow Cake:

1. Preheat oven to 350° F. Grease and flour a 13 x 9 x 2 inch baking pan, and a 6 x 9 x 2 inch pan, or whatever combination of pans that will hold 1 1/2 times the amount that a 13 x 9 x 2 pan holds.
2. Mix the flour with the salt and baking powder. Mix the Baileys with the milk.
3. Using electric mixer, cream the shortening with the sugar. Add the egg and vanilla, and beat well. Add the flour mixture, alternately with the Baileys and milk mixture. Beat for 2 minutes.
4. Pour half of the cake batter into the prepared pans, drop large spoonfuls of the Baileys Swirl (recipe below) into the pans alternately with large spoonfuls of the cake batter. Swirl with knife or fork to get a marbled effect.
5. Bake about 25-35 minutes, or until surface springs back when lightly pressed with fingertip.
6. Let cool, then spread with Baileys glaze (recipe below).

### Baileys Swirl

1. With electric mixer, beat cheese with butter and vanilla until creamy.
2. Add the confectioners sugar; beat until light and fluffy.
3. Stir in the Baileys and white chocolate, and mix well.

### Baileys glaze:

Mix 3/4 cup Baileys with 1 cup of the powdered sugar. Add more Baileys if the glaze is too thick; add more sugar if the glaze is too thin. Add more Baileys and sugar if there isn't enough glaze.

## 21 Dolphins Found Dead on Texas Beaches

March 4, 2008, 3:52PM GALVESTON - After 20 dead dolphins washed ashore on Southeast Texas beaches, officials are trying to determine their cause of death.

Of the 12 dolphins found early yesterday, six were newborns, three were about a year old and three were adults. That's according to Kim Amendola, a communication specialist with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration fisheries division.

Eight more dolphins washed up later in the afternoon. She did not have their ages.

Officials said that last year, about 70 dead dolphins washed up between Sabine Pass and Galveston in March. Amendola says that biologists couldn't find a cause of those deaths because the dolphins were so badly decomposed.

She urged anyone finding a dolphin body to phone the stranding network immediately so that a necropsy, or animal autopsy, can be done to preserve organs for further examination. To report a stranded dolphin, phone 409-942-7034.

## Diver Dies From Shark Bite in the Bahamas

By now, you have surely read about 49-year-old Austrian Markus Groh who died from a shark bite during a Bahamas shark-diving liveaboard trip with Jim Abernathy's Scuba Adventures. For years, Abernathy has been offering cage-free dives with hammerheads, tiger and bull sharks that Abernathy attract with chum. *Under-current* will write more about this in the April issue, but the question of liability will be a big one. Apparently, Groh signed a standard waiver releasing Abernathy from liability - the kind we divers hate to sign. While waivers have held up well in court, with the high profile of this death, expect an all-out attack on the waiver's validity. In a letter last year from the Bahamas Dive Association, all companies operating in Bahamas waters were told to cease and desist open-water, non-cage shark diving with potentially dangerous sharks. Neal Watson, the association's president, confirmed the letter was targeted at Abernathy's company, which was viewed as an "accident waiting to happen". Abernathy has refused to comply.

## Google Finds New Reefs

The computer tool Google Earth was responsible for the discovery of rare fringing coral reefs in Western Australia's remote Kimberly region. Chris Simpson, a coral reef specialist at West Australia's Department of Conservation, was viewing Google Earth satellite pictures of the Kimberly on his PC and spotted the never-before-seen reefs. Fringing coral reefs are rare and found only in a few places like the Red Sea, Madagascar and Western Australia's Ningaloo Marine Park. Simpson's discovery now makes the Kimberly a better candidate for marine park status.

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# Diving News Big Fish - What Size Pot?

## World's First Six-legged Octopus Discovered

(CNN) -- English marine experts have laid their hands on an octopus that's missing two of its own: a six-limbed creature that they have dubbed 'hexapus.' art.hexapus.jpg

Ordinarily, octopodes have eight arms and legs. And should they lose one or more in an accident, they can grow the limbs back.

Which is what makes 'Henry' -- as staffers at Blackpool Sea Life Centre in northwest England have dubbed their find -- so unique. His missing limbs stem from a birth defect. "If you look closer between the legs, there's webbing that attaches each of the arms together," John Filmer of the Sea Life Centre told CNN Tuesday. "You'd assume if he'd lost one of his legs in an accident, there would be space for an arm to grow back.

## Scientists spot white killer whale off Alaska

**ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP)** -- The white killer whale spotted in Alaska's Aleutian Islands sent researchers and the ship's crew scrambling for their cameras.

A rare white killer whale was spotted by federal scientists in late February off Alaska. The nearly mythic creature was real after all.

"I had heard about this whale, but we had never been able to find it," said Holly Fearnbach, a research biologist with the National Marine Mammal Laboratory in Seattle who photographed the rarity. "It was quite neat to find it."

Fearnbach said the white whale stood out. "When you first looked at it, it was very white," she said Thursday.

Further observation showed that while the whale's saddle area was white, other parts of its body had a subtle yellowish or brownish color.

The whale appeared to be a healthy, adult male about 25 to 30 feet long and weighing upward of 10,000 pounds.

THIBODAUX, La.—A medical student who blindfolds his friends to keep his favorite offshore fishing spot secret has come up with a record-beating fish—a Warsaw grouper weighing 359.1 pounds.



The giant hauled in by J.J. Tabor of Thibodaux is 12 ounces above the previous Louisiana state record, a state biologist confirmed.

It's been cut down to fillets. The first fillet weighed 53 pounds, Tabor said.

He caught it near an oil rig 70 miles south of Fourchon, in 400 feet of water. He won't give a more specific description.

'It's J.J.'s secret,' said Joey Rodrigue, a friend from Baton Rouge who joined Tabor and Tabor's father, John, on the record-making trip Saturday. 'I don't even know where I am.'

Tabor said he thought at first that his hook with a live hardtail on it had hit the bottom 'until I felt the big head shake.'

Rodrigue steered away from the rig.

'I put myself in a harness and just had to lay back and fight,' J.J. Tabor said. 'It was about a 15 or 20 minute fight.'

Tabor cleaned the fish late Monday afternoon outside his father's auto repair shop in Thibodaux. 'We'll split it up,' he said. 'I'll make some phone calls and try to get rid of it fresh. The rest, we'll vacuum pack it and cook it later.'

Tabor says he believes the fish is about 33 years old. He plans to send an inner-ear bone called the otolith to a university in Florida where researchers can help determine the age of the fish. He hopes to get the results in about four weeks.

**The world record, caught off Florida in 1985, is 436 pounds 12 ounces.**

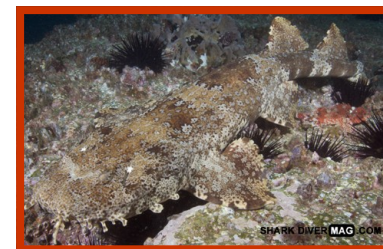
