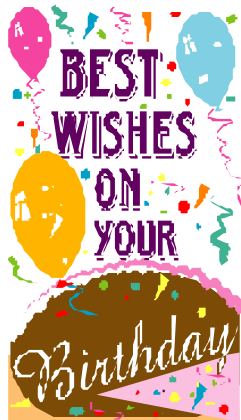

## White House Blocked Rule Issued to Shield Whales

[White House](#) officials for more than a year have blocked a rule aimed at protecting endangered North Atlantic right whales by challenging the findings of government scientists, according to documents obtained by the [Union of Concerned Scientists](#).

The documents, which were mailed to the environmental group by an unidentified [National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration](#) official, illuminate a struggle that has raged between the White House and NOAA for more than a year. In February 2007, NOAA issued a final rule aimed at slowing ships traversing some East Coast waters to 10 knots or less during parts of the year to protect the right whales, but the White House has blocked the rule from taking effect.

## Sea Lions Shot Dead on Columbia River as Salmon Battle Rages

Six federally protected sea lions were apparently shot to death on the Columbia River as they lay in open traps put out to ensnare the animals, which eat endangered salmon. State and federal authorities are investigating.

The discovery came one day after three elephant seals were found shot to death at a breeding ground in central California.

Trapping will be suspended during the investigation, said Rick Hargrave, a spokesman for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife who was at the scene Sunday.

The carcasses of the four California sea lions and two Steller sea lions were found Sunday around noon below the Bonneville Dam on the Columbia River on the border of Oregon and Washington.

The six animals appear to have been shot by somebody on the Washington side during the night, said Brian Gorman, a spokesman for the National Marine Fisheries Service.

## Gulf of Mexico Marine Sanctuary Proposal Faces Opposition

**NEW ORLEANS** - In an effort to burnish his legacy as a defender of the oceans, the Bush administration is considering creating a string of marine sanctuaries in the Gulf of Mexico.

But the proposal is hitting opposition from Republican senators fearful that the plan would hamper oil and natural gas drilling and hurt fishermen. Sen. David Vitter, R-La., said Wednesday that the proposal "holds potentially grave consequences" for the region's economy and comes at a sensitive time as Gulf states try to recover from devastating hurricanes. "The Gulf Coast economies are still in a state of flux, and we should be providing local industries with an appropriate support structure, not hampering their efforts and threatening further recovery," Vitter said.

He was joined by Alabama's two Republican senators, Richard Shelby and Jeff Session. The three senators sent an April 21 letter to James Connaughton, the chairman of the White House Council on Environmental Quality, to express their "strong objections" to the sanctuary plan.

The senators are worried that President Bush would invoke the 1906 National Antiquities Act to establish the sanctuaries, which would protect nine coral banks and hard-bottom areas extending in a large loop around the Gulf from Texas to Florida.

The law gives the president the power to designate ancient cultural sites and unusual geological features as national monuments and bypasses Congress and interest groups. Bush invoked the 1906 law in June 2006 when he set aside the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands and the surrounding waters, creating a monument spanning 140,000 square miles. The senators said declaring the areas monuments would not allow enough "public participation and stakeholder input."

Kristen Hellmer, a spokeswoman for CEQ, said that if the administration pursues the plan there would be "plenty of opportunities for anyone to provide input."

Billy Causey, a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration official working on the proposal, said the protected areas would be small in size and change very little in practice. Fishing and drilling are restricted in some of the areas in some of the areas.

Ecologically, the idea of protecting offshore oases dovetails with new research showing that the Gulf marine ecosystem relies on a ring of deep-water reefs and banks connected by the clockwise motion of ocean currents extending in a loop from Belize to the Florida Keys.

## REEF Receives Exotics Funding from Mote's Protect Our Reefs Fund

Dollars to Help Develop Rapid Response Plan

In April of this year, REEF received notice our proposal to develop a Marine Exotic Species Action Plan was partially funded through the Mote Marine Protect Our Reefs Fund, which is funded through the Florida coral reef license plate. The project funding will go towards a SE Florida workshop with key federal, state and local agencies to develop a coordinated response plan for dealing with non-native marine fish. To date there have been more than 20 species of non-native fishes documented in a four-county area in Southeast Florida. Of these, the indo-pacific lionfish has become established in the US and Bahamas and is rapidly spreading throughout the Caribbean. To help address this issue.

## Majority of Oceanic Shark Species Face Extinction

More than 50 percent of wide-ranging oceanic shark species are threatened with extinction as a result of overfishing, according to a new study.

The research, conducted by 15 scientists from institutes around the world and organized by the IUCN Shark Specialist Group, focused on oceanic pelagic sharks and rays, including great white sharks, whale sharks, crocodile sharks, bigeye threshers, basking sharks, shortfin makos, longfin makos, salmon sharks, silky sharks, porbeagle sharks, oceanic whitetip sharks, blue sharks, manta rays, spinetail devilrays, giant devilrays and Chilean devilrays.

The team determined that 16 out of the 21 oceanic shark and ray species that are caught in high seas fisheries are at heightened risk of extinction due primarily to targeted fishing for valuable fins and meat as well as indirect take in other fisheries.

In most cases, these catches are unregulated and unsustainable. The increasing demand for the delicacy "shark fin soup," driven by rapidly growing Asian economies, means that often the valuable shark fins are retained and the carcasses discarded.

This is the first study to determine the global threat status of 21 species of wide-ranging oceanic sharks and rays, said study leader Nicholas Dulvy of the Centre for Environment, Fishers and Aquaculture Science, Lowestoft Laboratory in the United Kingdom.
